How to Use This Book

Welcome to this Presidential Quiz Pack: U.S. Presidents 32-36! This book contains five quizzes or puzzles for each of the Presidents included, as well as a notebooking page and research prompts for each. There is also a wrap-up puzzle at the end that challenges students to match twenty world events with the name of the President in office when they occurred.

There are many ways to use this pack in your studies:

- It is perfect for review after students have studied a time period in history or social studies.
- Parents and teachers can use the pack to help create a list of ideas or areas you wish to explore as you plan your study.
- Students can use the book as a starting point for independent study. Have students take the quizzes to the library or use them at the computer to search for the answers to the questions. Allow plenty of time for rabbit trails so students can investigate facts and stories they discover as they complete their pack.
- It can also be used as a tool to help students practice and sharpen research and notetaking skills.
